





Scratchbuilder's Corner

Scratchbuilder's Corner continues to present aspects of scratchbuilding primarily with wood as the medium to build structures and rolling stock, but also includes the use of other materials such as styrene, brass, resin, and other casting materials.

Intentions here are teach & share techniques and "tricks" that can be adapted into your own scratchbuilding projects working from simple projects up through ones of increasing complexity. As such, this is not so much to provide projects that you are intended to build yourself, although that is certainly possible. Segments in January and February



have continued to introduce basic structure building projects as well as completing scratchbuilding another basic structure, Lomax's Welding. Thereafter, in January through February, this part of the show will move back to scratchbuilding rolling stock, which will most likely be some sort of maintenance of way cars of some purpose yet to be determined. As we move forward through 2024, the building of vintage old kits and what I term "resurrection" projects that require a healthy measure of scratchbuilding to complete will be presented.

The development of the Shantytown scene on the Rustic Buff & Old Gothic On30 model railroad reboot is steadily advancing, approaching a satisfactory level of completion, while also acknowledging the perpetual nature of such projects. This month's focus revolves around the creation of backdrop





buildings, billboards, and wooden fences. Another key priority is the construction of approximately six shanties, situated between the riveredge bait shops and the mentioned backdrop structures.

My personal objective is to transition to another section of the layout by the end of this month (February 2024). For those interested in tracking the progress of this scene, you can tune in to the live YouTube show "New Tracks Modeling" every Wednesday at 7:00 pm ET.

Additionally, all segments of New Tracks Modeling are broken-out and archived on YouTube, allowing for later viewing at your convenience.

What's to know about The Scales We Model In?

We have had many discussions with modelers who ask, "What is O scale or N scale all about? Does anyone really model in S scale? Can I really scratchbuild a model in N scale?" Your scale of choice may be G, O or O Hi-Rail, S, HO, or N, and there are others yet that modelers choose to build in today. However, we frequently know little about the details of other scales, are possessed of misinformation, or simple mythology.

To discuss this on a regular basis, New Tracks Modeling is running monthly segments on G, O, O Hi-Rail, S, HO, and N scale hosted by knowledgeable talented modelers in each scale. These modelers will try to answer your questions, present information about what is possible to accomplish, and then present what a new modeler entering a scale might need to consider.



D&RGW colors. After this photo was taken I weathered it a bit and added a lighted agent's office.

Here's the Coaling Tower. The top was a substitute from Mount Blue. I textured the plastic, shortened the legs for On30, scratchbuilt the chute, added Grandt Line hardware, and added the

lights and paint.



For the HO scale crowd we have three Items. First item is a Horizontal Boiler that can be used anywhere in a logging operation or an industrial location. Simple boiler but you can always add more to it. It could be a great abandoned piece near a old sawmill. Also comes with two fire wood piles. The figure in the pictures is not included. All resin casting and come unpainted. <u>Click here to check it out</u>





Second item is a small rural gas station where you could see a car or a tractor pull in for a fill up. Joe is going to be able to afford a real building someday. This is a one piece casting shown used in a scene with a 1934 Ford pickup and Joe putting the gas in and the driver stretching his legs and wiping his forehead. All resin casting and comes unpainted. Measures 3 3/4" by 3 1/2" and 1" high. <u>Click here to check it out</u>

Third item is a small water or fuel tank on skids. Could be used anywhere in a logging operation, industrial or portable fueling station. The figure in the pictures is not included. All resin casting and comes unpainted.

This month we have two items for the O scale group. First item is a great little junk pile that goes on the ground around a shop or in area with other junk. A lot of pipes and rods of different sizes and other detail. Measures 3 1/2" by 1 1/4". All resin casting and comes

Check out our new 3D printed Industrial Air Compressor kits in HO and O scale. May cost a little more but the detail is great.






One color, Two color, Three color, Four!



Reaching Applicants for the NMT Scholarship – Getting the Word Out!

Every reader of this newsletter can help get applicants for our scholarships both at their local HS and college levels. Promoting scholarship availability and reaching out to college students can be done through various effective methods. Here are some suggestions:

1. College Websites: Contact the administration or career services departments of various colleges and universities, asking them to include your scholarship opportunity on their websites or scholarship portals. This will ensure visibility to a large number of students.
