Eric Kennedy's series on "Becoming a Model Railroader" starts on the March 12, 2025 show and continues every two weeks until completed...

"On New Year's Day of 2023 I decided to make a New Year's Resolution different from any other year. After having been raised in a railroading family and spent some years as a railfanner, I decided to take on a new challenge, becoming a model railroader. I have plenty of space, but I wanted to start small, so I decided to build a 4' x 8' model railroad in HO scale. I spent much of the last two years acquiring the tools and materials I would need to build my layout including track, engines and rolling stock, bench materials, scenery materials, and other various pieces. I believe I am ready to begin this journey of assembling my model railroad with the help of New Tracks Modeling experts to help guide me along the way. Join me by watching my progress and I hope it inspires you to begin your own journey."

The micro layout that I built in the video features a kid's Thomas the Train engine that I converted to Deadrail using an RC car 2.4 GHz system. I painted all the cars and the engine plus added some details I had from my scrap box. I took my time and put to use techniques I have used in the construction of my home layout. I added a On30 Forney cab after removing the original Thomas part and added the O scale engineer. I reengineered the pistol transmitter controller to allow a Hands-free operation. The unique story about the acquisition of the original train was from a young 8 or 9 year who was progressing to HO scale and was selling off his Thomas trains to get the necessary capital to switch to the beginning of his model railroading career. Later I went by his selling table and saw the new items he had shopped for. I had the pleasure of helping him test his new diesel and showed him how to improve its performance. I will be showing this layout at the New Tracks table at the February Great Scale Train Show in Timonium, Md.



Scratchbuilder's Corner

Scratchbuilder's Corner presents aspects of scratchbuilding (and kitbashing) primarily with wood as the medium to build structures and rolling stock, but this includes the use of other materials such as styrene, brass, resin, and other casting

materials as appropriate.

Intentions here are to teach & share techniques and "tricks" that can be adapted into your scratchbuilding projects working from simple projects through those of increasing complexity.

Scratchbuilder's Corner entered December with an exploration of the







restoration (restoration of vintage rolling stock can easily count as scratchbuilding!) of a pair of Exacta kits cars of Wagner Sleeping Cars.

Scratchbuilding a Layout – Limestone Quarries on the RB & OG, By Tom Farrell (tfarrell60@comcast.net)

The Oolitic Limestone Quarry scene was a defining feature of my original Rustic Buff & Old Gothic On30 model railroad (2008–2022). Rarely depicted in model railroading, it was a unique and authentic scene on my layout.

Set in 1930, during the height of the Great Depression, my fictional RB & OG Railroad was inspired by the southern Indiana limestone belt, renowned for producing dimensional cut stone used in many of America's most iconic structures, including the Empire State Building, the Pentagon, the National Cathedral, and numerous federal and state buildings. I blended this rich architectural history with the gritty urban backdrop of Pittsburgh, my hometown, to create a dynamic theme that tied together two distinct yet complementary worlds for my railroad.

Your scale of choice may be G, O or O Hi-Rail, S, HO, or N, and there are others yet that modelers choose to build in today.
